

Foundation of the British Community

The British Community (BC) may prefer not to initiate negotiations with the UK regime until the Greek Marbles are returned to Greece. This symbolic gesture would show the need to move away from systems based on theft.

The BC will not interfere in the political process of the UK regime in London and the Home Counties (so this excludes Prague), including military operations by its agencies against any part of the population in London and the Home Counties.

The BC will allow transport of non-nuclear and non-biological military equipment to London and the Home Counties as requested by the UK regime or its military infrastructure.

The BC will facilitate the continuation of BBC services within London and the Home Counties.

Should the UK regime request it, the BC may decide to assist it in the provision of services, including and especially humanitarian ones, in London and the Home Counties.

The BC recognises the independence of Scotland under a decision determined by universal suffrage there.

It further recognises the administration of Berwick as belonging to Scotland under similar circumstances.

The BC will recognise the independence of Northern Ireland, or Ulster, or any part of it, under conditions of a referendum recognised by the government of the Republic of Ireland.

The BC has no military structure and will never have any military structure.
